	 Dr. Keshav Prasad Singh was appreciative of the Black Soldier Fly-DST project and opined that Food production & Storage is very crucial; aeroponic farming/vertical farming etc are on the emerging technologies
	When the Principal sought opinion of the expert members regarding the plan of going for 'Institutional Research Centre, Dr. Keshav Prasad Singh shared his idea through his loud thinking that K.S. Rangasamy College of Technology

- should work on the idea of one Centre of Excellence at the National Level. There should be no parallel in the country for it; there should be frequent brainstorming at all levels and he asserted that 5 years down the line, KSRCT can achieve it
- Dr.K.Annamalai fell in line with this idea with thrust given to the indigenous markets like Textile and Dr. Lavanam Amballa said that there is niche market for new ventures in the Textile technology related areas
- Dr.K.Annamalai pointed the existing practice at Anna University that if students have arrears in 3rd Semester they may not eligible for 7th Semester registration; he suggested that it may be added in the regulation
- The expert members suggested highlighting the significance of details while presenting large data at a forum
- Dr. Keshava Prasad Singh confirmed about the professional Development allowance for all the faculty and it may be ensured that the faculty contribute back to the institution by way of Consultancy and other such activities

- Dr.P.Parthiban highlighted the efforts of the principal in improving the placement prospects by all means

 placement is a big challenge everywhere but appreciated the principal's efforts

- Dr. Keshava Prasad Singh has appreciated Dr. Annamalai's suggestion as viable and insisted that 'cultivation of thinking' should be imbibed among the students
- Dr. Lavanam Amballa appreciated the principal's singular efforts in skilling students at a massive scale.
- Dr.K.Annamalai suggested the Principal to look into the policy bottlenecks and pinched on ways to ease out the policy framework
- Dr. Kehava Prasad Singh appreciated the 'infectious encouragement' given to student winners of the Inventor's Challenge

- Dr.K.Annamalai suggested having more students from other states on the rolls and Dr. Lavanam added that excelling in a few domains will attract more students from other states
- Dr. Lavanam Amballa also added that the principal, along with his academic team, may explore as to how many of the people's/Society's/companies' problems has the college solved; this reflective exercise will nudge us more towards identifying & solving their problems through different projects and the people/Companies should naturally approach you/your think tank for a solution to their problems; this visibility will also attract many other state/other country students to our institution
